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Deductible	A deductible is a specific, fixed dollar amount of charges for which the member is responsible. The deductible amount must be met before health insurance benefits can be paid.
Delaware Senate Bill 22: Coverage for Autism Spectrum Disorder	Effective December 11, 2012, for new and renewing policies, insurers in Delaware must provide coverage for the screening, diagnosis, and treatment of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) for children under the age of 21. This is a State of Delaware mandate and is limited to fully-insured group and individual policies. The law specifically requires coverage for Applied Behavioral Analysis (ABA) therapy subject to an annual per person maximum of \$36,000 which will be adjusted each year by the Delaware Department of Insurance to reflect changes in the Consumer Price Index.
Dependent	A dependent is any member of a subscriber's family who meets the applicable eligibility requirements and is enrolled in a program.
