Antibiotic Awareness Week is November 18-24, 2020, and is observed to raise awareness on the appropriate use and prescribing of antibiotics. Antibiotics are one of the most commonly prescribed drugs today.

Antibiotics are critical in saving lives and treating infections. However, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), an estimated 47 million courses of antibiotics are unnecessarily prescribed each year for nonbacterial type infections, such as the cold or flu. Inappropriate prescribing of antibiotics can lead to side effects and antibiotic resistance.
