Antibiotics can help patients feel better — and save lives — but only if they are used appropriately.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), at least thirty percent (30%) of the antibiotics in U.S. outpatient settings are prescribed unnecessarily. Whenever antibiotics are used, they can cause side effects and lead to antibiotic-resistant infections.

Your patients may ask you if they need antibiotics if they are feeling ill. It's important that you educate your patients who do need antibiotics about how to use them appropriately.

For providers participating in our True Performance and other Value Based Reimbursement programs, appropriate antibiotic use is a key performance measure that can affect reimbursement rates.
