USING CORRECT ANATOMICAL MODIFIERS

Please ensure you are using correct Anatomical Modifiers when filing a claim. Using incorrect anatomical modifiers, or no modifiers, can result in claims being delayed, denied, or processed/paid incorrectly.

The chart below lists some of the most commonly used anatomical modifiers. The chart is **NOT** an all-inclusive list of modifiers and their required usage.

Modifier	Description
E1-E4	Eyelids
FA-F9	Fingers
TA-T9	Toes
LC / RC	Left / right circumflex, coronary artery
LD	Left anterior descending coronary artery
LM	Left main coronary artery
RI	Ramus intermedius

What This Means For You

Please share this important information to the claims/coding staff members at your practice or facility. As a reminder, claims for Highmark members should be submitted with the appropriate coding and should be coded to the highest level of specificity, using the correct modifiers and diagnosis and procedure codes.
