National Infant Immunization Week is April 22-29

<u>National Infant Immunization Week</u> highlights the importance of protecting children 2 years and younger from vaccine-preventable diseases.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommend that children stay on track with their well-child appointments and routine vaccinations.

In recent years, there have been outbreaks of measles, mumps, whooping cough, and other vaccinepreventable diseases in the United States. On-time vaccination is critical to provide protection against these potentially life-threatening diseases.

Informing and Educating Parents

The CDC recommends the <u>following communication strategies</u> on how to talk to parents regarding their child's vaccinations:

- Assume Parents Will Vaccinate State which vaccines the child needs to receive.
- **Give Your Strong Recommendation** If parents express concerns, then share your strong vaccine recommendation.
- Listen to and Respond to Parents' Questions Seek to understand parents' concerns and provide requested information.

If parents are hesitant to vaccinate their child, point them to the CDC's <u>Making the Vaccine Decision</u>: <u>Addressing Common Concerns</u> webpage, which promotes the safety and effectiveness of vaccines.
