## CHIP DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING REQUIREMENTS AND BILLING GUIDELINES

The Pennsylvania Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) requires annual developmental screenings for all children at ages one, two, and three. Periodic developmental screenings during a child's first three years can be an important tool to identify delays in physical, social, intellectual, and emotional development.

If you perform a developmental screening during a well-child visit for a CHIP enrollee three years of age or younger, you must submit claims for **BOTH** the developmental screening **AND** the well-child visit. Developmental screenings are reimbursable using procedure code **96110**.

Providers participating in True Performance can utilize the CHIP GAP Report, which is posted monthly under the Quality Blue section in NaviNet<sup>®</sup>, to identify CHIP enrollees who require a developmental screening.
